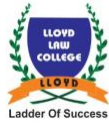

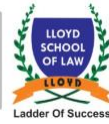
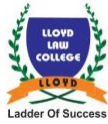

At Lloyd, we are dedicated to producing leaders who are not only skilled in the law but are also equipped with the intellectual tools to navigate the complexities of democratic societies. Through a combination of rigorous legal education and an emphasis on debate, we aim to cultivate professionals who can reason, argue, and lead with integrity and openness.

Rules & Regulations ::

1. The Intra- Batch Debate Competition is **open for all the students of B.A.LL.B., B.Com.LL.B. (2024-2029) & LL.B. (2024-2027)**.



2. The students of **B.A.LL.B. & B.Com.LL.B. (2024-2029)** and **LL.B. (2024-2027)** who wish to become a part of Lloyd's Debate Society **must participate and qualify in all three rounds** of the selection process to be held on **Saturday 05 October 2024**.
3. A member of Lloyd's DebSoc must not join any other society for the next one year i.e. May 2025.
4. Only selected members of the DebSoc who will work for a year with the DebSoc will then be allowed to appear in the Intra-Selection Rounds of Lloyd Moot Court Society and LIMA. Intra-Selection Rounds of MCS & LIMA will be held in the month of May 2025.
5. Your membership in DebSoc is subject to Minimum Mandatory 80% physical class attendance, that must be maintained to remain member of DebSoc.
6. Training sessions will be held from Monday to Friday, 02 PM – 05 PM.
7. Members must attend minimum 80% training sessions for continuing membership.
8. No member shall be allowed to participate in any competition if their academic and training sessions' attendance is less than 80% respectively.
9. Only members of the DebSoc shall be allowed to participate on behalf of Lloyd in competitions in India and outside India.

Prize Money & Gifts ::

1. The competition is open to all the students of B.A.LL.B., B.Com.LL.B. (2024-2029) & LL.B. (2024-2027) only.
2. Top 05 position holders of both rounds, Round 01 and Round 02, will receive a cash prize of Rs. 05k, 04k, 03k, 02k and 01k respectively along with gift book.
3. Top 05 scorers of all the three rounds (marks consolidated), Elocution, Extempore and Personal Interview, will receive a cash prize of Rs. 10k, 09k, 08k, 06k and 05k respectively along with gifts.

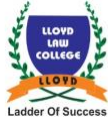

Competition Rules ::

Language :: The medium for all the rounds shall be either Hindi or English only.

Dress :: Formal attire.

Round 01 :: Elocution

1. Maximum Time is 03 minutes. Candidate will be disqualified on exceeding the time limit.
2. Reading out the entire speech from the paper/phone is not allowed. However, one can keep a short note for reference.



3. Participants will be judged under the mentioned categories – Content, Language, Body Language, and Delivery.

Round 02 :: Extempore

1. Maximum time limit to prepare 02 minutes and the maximum time for speech is 03 minutes.
2. The participant will be allowed to select the topic once only.
3. Participants will not be allowed to take any paper or material with them during the speech. However, one can keep a short note for reference.
4. Use of mobile phones throughout the round is strictly prohibited.
5. Participants will be judged in the mentioned categories – Content, Language, Body Language, and Delivery.

Round 03 :: Personal Interview

Participants will be judged based on their language and debating experience and professional mannerism.
