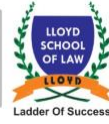
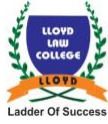

Happy Constitution Day!

Lloyd is celebrating the 75th Year of the Constitution of India as Samvidhan Week from Tuesday 26 - Saturday 30 Nov. 2024. We have planned various activities for the same. The details of activities, time and faculty in-charges are provided here. All are requested to take the charge of their respective duties. Faculty in-charge are requested to take students volunteers for working along with them in these activities.

Constitution Law Extempore Moot Court Competition Rules and Regulations

ARTICLE 1 – OBJECTIVE :: The present 'Rules' shall govern the 'Lloyd Extempore Moot Court Competition, 2024', for all the batches of B.A.LL.B & B.Com.LL.B. of Lloyd Law College and Lloyd School of Law.

ARTICLE 2 - SUBJECT :: All participating teams in the Competition are presumed to possess knowledge of, and shall be bound by, these Rules. Participants are encouraged to familiarize themselves with constitutional provisions, case laws, and contemporary issues.

ARTICLE 3 – INTERPRETATION OF THE RULES :: The Organizing Committee retains the authority to construe and revise the provisions delineated in the Rules. The Organizing Committee retains the prerogative to effect alterations when deemed required.

ARTICLE 4 – AIM OF THE COMPETITION :: This Constitutional Law Extempore Moot Competition aims to encourage students to specialize the application of art of persuasive advocacy, hone their legal drafting, argumentation, and counselling skills; and think broadly and critically about constitutional legal problem solution.

ARTICLE 5 - PARTICIPATION :: The Competition is open for all the bona-fide students of B.A.LL.B & B.Com.LL.B Lloyd Law College and Lloyd School of Law.

ARTICLE 6 – TEAM COMPOSITION :: Each team shall comprise of 02 members.

ARTICLE 7 – TEAM REGISTRATION :: Each team is required to register by completing a designated Google Form in its entirety. No team shall be permitted to register beyond this stipulated date and time.

ARTICLE 8 – STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION :: The competition shall consist of the following rounds:



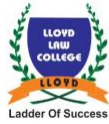
1. **Preliminary Round :** Speaking Time shall consist of 10 minutes per team. One speaker may take maximum of 6 minutes. Rebuttals/Surrebuttals shall not be allowed. The participants are required to submit a skeletal memorial of arguments advanced of maximum one page.
2. **Quarter-Finals :** Speaking Time shall consist of 12 minutes per team. One speaker may take maximum of 7 minutes. Rebuttals/Surrebuttals shall not be allowed. The participants are required to submit a skeletal memorial of arguments advanced of maximum one page.
3. **Semi-Finals :** Speaking Time shall consist of 15 minutes per team. One speaker may take maximum of 8 minutes. Rebuttals/Surrebuttals shall not be allowed. The participants are required to submit a skeletal memorial of arguments advanced of maximum one page.
4. **Finals :** Speaking Time shall consist of 25 minutes per team. One speaker may take maximum of 13 minutes. Rebuttals/Surrebuttals shall not be allowed. The participants are required to submit a skeletal memorial of arguments advanced of maximum one page.
5. The draw of lots for allocation of sides would be conducted prior to each round and participants would be given a minimum of 2 hours to prepare their arguments.

ARTICLE 9 – SCORING :: The evaluation criteria for the competition shall encompass:

- Knowledge of Facts.
- Logic and Reasoning.
- Organization and Clarity.
- Persuasiveness.
- Deference to the Court.
- Proficient and Articulate Analysis of the Issues Arising from Facts.
- Profound Understanding of the Legal Principles Directly Applicable to the Issues.
- Capability to Convey Legal Principles Clearly Within the Designated Timeframe.
- Command over Legal Sources, Authorities, and General Principles of Law.
- Ingenuity

ARTICLE 10 – GENERAL DECLARATION :: The Organizing Committee reserve the right to amend any rules of the competition. Any change so made shall be intimated to the teams. The decision of the organizers shall be binding on everyone. If any participant is found misbehaving with volunteers, court masters, judges, fellow participants, or the organizers during the competition or in respect of the competition shall be liable for termination or disciplinary action or both [as the case may be].

ARTICLE 11 – GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL :: In case of any grievances, the participants can approach the resource persons of the Organizing Committee.



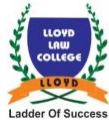
